## Options for iPhone Photography/Camera Users

- Take the photo in the mode you plan to publish.

For example: panorama, square, photo. What are you planning on doing with the photo?

- In Settings, enable the Grid, the rule of thirds, and keep this option.
- Turn off the flash. Experiment. Your phone may not ever need the flash on.
- For action shots, use the Burst setting. Tap and hold the volume button.
- Use the HDR auto mode, the high dynamic range. Why you ask? It provides the eyes with more luminance for increasing details for the brain.
- Spot image for macro. Tap and hold on the item in the photo. Enlarge before taking the photo.
- Use exposure meter for lightening and darkening images if it is available in your settings.
- You can take photos with the volume button to decrease blur-phone movement.
- If you are proficient with photo editing, shoot in RAW. Raw collects more photo data. They appear as .png a portable network graphic that is a lossless file format.
